FAITH LEADS FORMER PROTESTANT TO DONATE KIDNEY

The Catholic Faith and love of God have born astounding fruit in the life of Marilyn Booze.

"I wasn't looking for any new religious experience," relates Marilyn Booze, "but those AM 820 bumper magnets piqued my interest. I saw the first one as I was driving home from work in Lancaster. I took fleeting notice of it but it stuck in the back of my mind. I wasn't curious about the Catholic Faith. I thought that I knew everything about the Catholic Faith which I picked up at home." Catholicism was on the fringe of the radar screen in Marilyn's family.

Marilyn found a home in the Catholic Church

"About six months after the fleeting bumper magnet experience, another AM 820 bumper magnet really caught my attention," Marilyn continues, "and I turned on AM 820 thinking I'd hear monks chanting." What Marilyn heard on St. Gabriel Radio surprised her. In fact, she was riveted by what she heard. She recalls thinking, "This is Truth. This is right and that is wrong, unwaveringly." The messages resonated with her heart. "I found a home and didn't know there was such a place! I was like a dry sponge soaking up the Faith!"

One day, Marilyn dropped by a Catholic parish office to pick up some materials. She wasn't sure just what she wanted. The parish secretary gave her a copy of the Catechism of the Catholic Church and RCIA (Right of Christian Initiation for Adults) information. As she looked over the information she said to herself, "Who are you trying to kid? You're never going to become Catholic!" Yet, she couldn't turn away. She joined Our Lady of Mount Carmel parish in Buckeye Lake and became involved in parish life. One of her first activities was coordinating special events like funeral lunches.

Facebook plea for kidney donation

Catholic radio gave Marilyn new insight into the meaning of "love one another" and raised that command to a new, deeper significance of sacrifice for the good of others. This Catholic teaching has born astounding fruit in Marilyn's life.

"I saw a plea from a former classmate in need of a kidney on the Facebook page of my Newark, Ohio high school Class of '75," says Marilyn. She'd never met Ron, her former classmate, since there were over 700 people in their graduating class. They graduated in the same class but never knew each other before the Facebook connection. Still, Marilyn decided to respond, asking what blood type he had. He answered, 'A positive.' That's the same blood type as Marilyn. They met and started the process. The tests all came back in favor of the kidney donation.

"I realized that I was chosen as an instrument of God's love. On September 9 of last year, I donated one of my kidneys to this man. I was not the least nervous. I knew that God was in control." Marilyn emphasizes that she let the recipient know that her kidney donation was made because of her Catholic Faith and love of God! "We remain in contact and I can see his faith grow," marvels Marilyn.

"My husband was so concerned about this decision but he was supportive. The morning of the surgery, Ron's mother came to the hospital room. She buried her face on my shoulder and sobbed with gratitude," relates Marilyn. "This kidney donation was pure

joy! A gift to me as well. The Lord gave me the grace to go through with it." Marilyn credits the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for this. The kidney transplant was a resounding success. Ron thrives now with normal kidney function.

Marilyn's journey home has presented many joys and blessings and a few challenges. "I've gotten flack along the way," she says. Many in her family have struggled with her decision to become Catholic. She's elated that one of her brothers and her son have joined her pilgrimage home through the Church. "My brother and I didn't know that either of us was exploring the Catholic Faith!" she explains.

Marilyn beams as she tells, "My five-year-old granddaughter turned to me during Mass one Sunday and said, 'I have a Church, too, Grandma!"

It was a special surprise when one of her Protestant relatives, who doesn't understand Marilyn's Faith walk, gave to Marilyn a treasure of Catholic medals that had belonged to Marilyn's grandmother. These family medals are precious to her and she wears the medals with great feeling. "My hope is that one day, I'll be able to share the joy of my Faith with the rest of my family. I wish that my loved ones understood that you can't get closer to Jesus than in the Eucharist."

Marilyn works as a phlebotomist at Doctor's Hospital. She listens to AM 820 as she drives to Columbus from Buckeye Lake. She's now excited to start listening to St. Gabriel Radio at home via her computer. She also plans to set up her smart phone so that she can listen most anywhere.
